On behalf of Vice Admiral Daniel Dwyer, USN, Director of the Combined Joint Operations from the Sea Centre of Excellence (CJOS COE), I am delighted to invite you to participate in our forthcoming roundtable on improving Global Maritime Security.

Building upon the progress made in previous roundtable forums, the seventh annual Maritime Security Regimes Roundtable (MSR RT) is scheduled to take place November 2-3, 2022, at the historic Slover Library in Norfolk, Virginia, USA.

The aim of the MSR RT will be to achieve a better understanding of the current global maritime security environment, examine how it can be improved, and determine what best practices can be employed across regimes to better achieve security goals. Working from the theme “A New Chess Board: New Dynamics and Contemporary Challenges in an Increasingly Demanding Maritime Security Environment,” the agenda will seek to continue the work of the previous annual roundtable discussions carried out since 2015. As a result of the current events in Ukraine and the remarkable impact of climate change in our societies, both aspects will have an important role during this year’s roundtable due to their implications on global maritime security.

This year’s MSR RT will be conducted in-person via a panel format with presentations providing perspectives on the overall themes and followed by a Q&A session. The panels will broadly address the following topics:

- Ukraine Scenario and its Destabilizing Effects on Maritime Security
- Climate Change Impact in Maritime Domain
- New Technologies Contribution to Maritime Security
- Realities, Challenges, and Perspectives in the Maritime Industry

The presentations and plenary sessions will be conducted at the unclassified level and the audience will be drawn from ‘invite only’ participants from the international maritime community, representing a strong cross-section of government, non-government, military, academic and industry stakeholders.
